Why Prayer?

- It shows our dependence on God.
- The New Testament Models It:
 - o Acts 2:42
 - o Colossians 1:3,9
- Your relationships will <u>deepen</u>.

What does prayer look like in a Community Group?

• Model It.

- Live it privately.
- Model it publically.
- Basic Guide for Group Prayer:
 - Short simple prayers create safety.
 - Simple prayers are direct and honest.

• Keep It Safe - Consider the New Person

- O Don't call on someone to pray. Ask for a volunteer(s)
 - "Not everyone needs to pray, but we would love to pray for everyone."
- O Don't expect everyone to pray every time.
- Try to avoid praying in a <u>circle</u>.
- O Be clear on who will <u>close</u> the prayer time.

• Guide the Prayer Time

- O Have a plan.
- O Keep it to 30 40 minutes
- o Mix it up.

10 Creative Ideas for Group Prayer

- 1. Popcorn Style.
- 2. Share a request. Pray for a request.
- 3. Everyone writes down a request. Everyone takes a request. Everyone follows up with a phone call or text during the week.
- 4. Someone records all the requests and then sends an email or text to the group.
- 5. Shrink it down. Groups of 2 or 3.
- 6. If someone is in crisis, stop right then and pray for him or her.
- 7. One sentence prayers. "God I am thankful for ______."
- 8. In couples groups, have spouses pray for each other during men's and women's time.
- 9. Pray through a Psalm together. (Psalm 23, 121, 139)
- 10. Pick a verse of Scripture to pray for another throughout the week. (Colossians 1:9, Ephesians 3:14-19)
