ICEBREAKER (5-10 Minutes)

- 1. Share your name and answer the following question:
 - What is something that brought you joy this week?

OPENING THE DISCUSSION (5-10 Minutes) – Have someone recap the message in about a minute or two and then ask the following questions:

DIGGING DEEPER (10 Minutes) – ask everyone to follow along in their Bible or Bible app. You might consider looking up these passages online and sharing your screen to review them together.

- 3. Read James 1:1-12.
 - What themes stand out to you from this passage?
- 4. Reread James 1:2.
 - Is responding to trials with pure joy even possible? What would that even look like?
 - What can we learn from the rest of this passage about how we can respond with joy?
- 5. Reread James 1:2-4 and vs 12.
 - Who is someone you know who has exemplified these verses well in their own trials? How has their faith impacted you?
- 6. Read John 16:33.
 - What hope do Jesus' words give us when life is hard?
