**ICEBREAKER (5-10 Minutes)**

1. **Share your name and answer one of the following questions:**
  - What subject do you know the most about?
  - What is a subject you'd like to learn more about?

**OPENING THE DISCUSSION (5-10 Minutes)**

2. **What questions or tensions did this sermon raise for you?**
3. What part of Sunday's sermon did you find most helpful?
4. **Nate's main point was that "God knows everything. We don't."**
  - What is your gut reaction to that statement? What does it make you think or feel?

**DIGGING DEEPER (10 Minutes)**

5. **Read Psalm 139:1-4.**
  - How might the words or statements in these verses bring us comfort?
6. Read Jeremiah 16:17 and Hebrews 4:13.
  - How can we use these verses to help us fight sin?
7. **Read 1 John 3:19-21.**
  - According to these verses, how might God's omniscience "knowing everything" bring us confidence?

**APPLYING IT (10-20 Minutes)**

8. Nate mentioned that God's Omniscience provides for us with 3 things:
  1. Comfort
  2. Caution
  3. Confidence
  - Which one is most helpful for you right now?
  - How do you plan to practically utilize this truth this week?
9. What is one thing you want to remember from this sermon this week?
