

Do Good Group Leaders Need To Be Good Teachers?


Teachers

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Never Skip The Icebreaker

Icebreaker Questions Should Be:

- Easy To Answer (Quickly)
- Fun
- (Optionally) Relevant
- "What Was Your Childhood Like?"

The Aim Is To:

- Make People Comfortable
 (Get The Hardest Part Over First)
- Involve Everyone (This goes for the discussion, too.)



How Do We Lead A Good Discussion?

What are we after?

- A teacher wants questions answered ACCURATELY
- A facilitator wants questions answered HONESTLY

What is a good question?

- A question you don't know the answer to
- Don't go fishing!

(If you have something to say, then say it.)

Questions That ALWAYS Work

Two Great Questions

- What are your exclamation points?
 - What grabbed your attention?
 - What can't you stop thinking about?
 - What changed the way you understand something?

• What are your question marks?

- What confused you?
- What are you not sure you accept?
- What do you think is impractical? Contradictory?

Questions That ALWAYS Work

Three Life-Changing Questions

- What was important to you?
- Why was it important to you?
- How does that make a difference in your life?

Create Space For Growth

- Be comfortable with silence

My best criteria for a good question is a question that I don't have the answer to. If I ask an observation question, there is a "right" answer. We don't want "right" answers (from a factual point of view). We want honest answers (meaning we want to hear people's stories). And only they can tell us that.

Closed question (bad): What does Jesus tell the Ephesian church to do?

Open question (good): Jesus tells the Ephesian church, "I hold this against you: You have forsaken the love you had at first." When it comes to your walk with Jesus, do you feel far from or close to your "first love?" Why do you think that is?
